THE METHOD

To get a person to take action, you must first get him or her to take ownership of the issue. The person must feel a need to get involved. Through role-playing with students and his portrayal of intriguing characters on stage, Mike effectively exhibits

the problems in the current dating norms. Thus, moving the audience to admit to the many problems in their own dating behaviors and choices. Once they take ownership, Mike provides the students with the solution of "asking first."

WHAT ABOUT SURVIVORS

Few students know how to properly provide support to a survivor of sexual assault. From his years of listening to survivors across the country, Mike found survivors regularly disappointed in people saying, "I'm sorry to hear you were raped" and so he shares with students the words every survivor deserves to hear.

"After your presentation in March of this year, our 13 year old daughter (who deals with GAD and ADD in addition to being a teenager) reported an incident that she had been hiding from us for nearly a year. A 14 year old boy had used coercion to force her into a second 'experiment' with the threat that he would tell everyone she was a slut and did _____ (the sexual act) anyway. She held this inside from early July until a few days after your presentation, when she filed a report with the school counselor.

Needless to say, there were multiple incidents during the time she held the information in: he told everyone lies about her anyway, created an enormous amount of turmoil and so forth, resulting in GAD accelerating into RX treated depression. While the results of her disclosure required involvement of the police and child welfare,

HELP!

My Teen is Dating – The Program PARENTS Are Asking For.



Many schools ask, "Once we bring Mike to speak to the students, how do we help our parents continue the message in their homes?" Bring Mike directly to your parents – during lunch or early evening.

We need to be blunt here: sexual dangers are monumental for today's teenagers. With TV, teen magazines, music, and movies promoting sexual activity among teens, parents are struggling with how to handle their sons and daughters being exposed to images making sexual activity look exciting and even popular.

The pressure for teens to be more sexual, including engaging in sexual activity, is stronger than ever. With all the talk of fondling, oral sex, and intercourse among today's teenagers, how do you protect your teenager (or even pre-teen)?

You know the old parenting tactics of the past will not work with your children. Letting them find out on their own is way too dangerous and scary!

Why is "making your child safe" such a daunting task? Because you can't always be there to protect them, especially when they're dating or going to parties where "hook-ups" are going to happen.

With parenting magazines always geared at parents of kids under 10 years old, where do Moms and Dads find advice for talking to their teen? Have you tried talking to a teen about dating, sex, and intimacy? Isn't it amazing how teenagers don't believe you can possibly understand the feelings they are going through?

If you've tried talking to a teen about dating, then you've probably already gotten the "look." You know the one. The look of "don't even bother." Let's see if you can relate to any of the following responses:

Usual teenager responses to "the talk":

- Rolling of the eyes
- The look of "You don't know anything. You don't get it."
- "Yea, Yea, Whatever" as they walk away.
- "I am not talking with YOU about this."
- "I'm not doing any of this stuff anyways. You don't need to worry."
- "I get it, okay?"

As you know, many teenagers love to talk with their friends about intimacy, dating, boys, girls, and even sexual situations. If they are having fun talking to their friends while getting lectured by their parents, who are they likely to follow? Think back to your teenage years for a moment.

As a parent, trying to "figure this out" on your own can be very difficult. Once you say one statement your teen feels is not "cool", you can lose your credibility with him or her. Then you are likely to fall into 1 of 2 traps. You try to overcompensate and suddenly be cool OR you go into the "because I said so" mode. Now your teen is reminded of how much you don't understand them or their world. Suddenly, you've lost a golden opportunity for a vitally important connection to your teenager. Who wins? Their friends. Who loses in the long-run? You and your teen!

"Mr. Domitrz presented 'Can I Kiss You?' on April 22, 2003 at two of the agency's local high schools. Two of his audiences were about 450 students in size and the other was a full school assembly of 1,100 students. For both size groups he was able to engage them and hold their attention for the duration of the presentations (approximately 1 hour each). A number of students felt comfortable enough to approach Mr. Domitrz and compliment him directly on his presentation afterward.

Sexual assault and topics related to it are often quite a challenge to present in an effective manner. THE CHALLENGE

When it comes to addressing sexual assault awareness, students often struggle to connect with the issues. For years, students have been hearing sexual assault

statistics and many still don't believe it can happen to them. Students have been told "No Means No" and "Get Consent First." However, they are rarely being taught exactly how to get consent or even how consent is defined.

At the core of understanding consent is the concept of asking first. Institutions across the country are beginning to realize why "asking first" needs to become the focus of sexual assault awareness education. Imagine if each person was always "asking first" and then respecting a partner's choice. Schools and communities would see a tremendous drop in sexual assault occurrences. Survivors would be more likely to report sexual assaults because they would know what was done to them was wrong.

HOW DO YOU DO IT?

The most challenging question is: How do you get students to change to "asking first" after 12 to 18 years of socialization that says, "Whatever you do, don't ask. Just go for it?" You need a creative program that tears down a student's wall of fears and concerns. You need a presenter who gets the students comfortable enough to look into themselves and see a need for change. You want a presentation which gives students the tools to have confidence in themselves in all situations.

"Issues surrounding sexual assault are very sensitive and rarely talked about topics, especially with adolescents. Mike not only educated students on a level with which they could relate but he really got the students involved in his presentation. Before [our students] came to hear Mike, only 21% of the high school students disagreed with this statement!!!! In other words, almost 80% of the kids felt that if a woman doesn't say 'NO', it's ok to go ahead and do what you want!!!

When we asked this same question AFTER your presentation, however, we saw a dramatic difference. After hearing you speak, 60% of these same students disagreed with the statements. I think these numbers are strong, strong testament to the power Mike's presentation had on our young people."






I, _____, pledge to do my best to help my family, friends, and peers in potentially dangerous situations in which drugs, alcohol, a violent person, or other threats to their safety and well-being are present. I will do this by having the focus and self-control necessary to remain aware of my surroundings, the wisdom to identify dangerous situations, and the courage to take action in confronting my friends when their judgment is impaired.

I recognize that these dangerous situations may arise at times when people feel safe and comfortable, such as at bars, parties (especially when alcohol is influencing the situation and a person is trying to “hook up” with another individual), or in the context of a romantic relationship. I realize that it may not always be easy to help people from harm in these situations, but by remaining watchful and showing care and concern, I may help to prevent a sexual assault from occurring.

I understand that the ONLY person responsible for a sexual assault is the person who engages in sexual contact without the consent of the other person. Through my own positive words, actions, and beliefs, I am taking the responsibility of helping to end sexual assault. I will share with people the importance of consent and the need to obtain consent with your partner by Asking First. I will treat all survivors of sexual assault with my respect and admiration. I will inform all of my family, friends, and peers that “If anyone ever has or ever does sexually touch you without your consent, I will fully support you. I will always be here for you. Always (from simply listening to helping you seek the proper support from professionals!)” During the next 24 hours, I will start taking action by saying these words to at least 3 people.

Sexual assault is a horrific and traumatic crime. My active commitment to this project will help reduce the violence in my community and create a safer atmosphere for everyone.

A little later in the day, it was time for Mike to speak to the 6th and 7th graders. They all sat on the floor of

the gymnasium as he began the program. What did the students think? How would the differences in culture affect Mike's ability to connect? Mike chose to stick with the approach he takes speaking in North America—let the students tell him how they live and deal with these issues. THEY DID! The males and females were open and honest about their cultural beliefs and understandings.

When Mike asked the students why a female does not ask for intimacy in their culture, a male said, *"The Man is the Ruler of the Home."* As Mike inquired deeper into these beliefs and asked all the students a few more questions, that same male ended up saying the man should respect the woman and always give her choices (including her right to "ask"). By the end of the program, the students committed to "Asking First."

BEING AGE APPROPRIATE with MIDDLE SCHOOLS & HIGH SCHOOLS!

The AFTER EFFECTS

A Wave of Positive Change

Through a community education grant, Hope House of South Central Wisconsin was able to co-sponsor the “Can I Kiss You?” program at three of our local high schools in Columbia County. We were thrilled we had the opportunity to bring Mike Domitrz to speak. He did a fantastic job connecting with all of the students and using humor to demonstrate his simple yet vital messages about respect and consent.

One principal shared they have never had an assembly such as the “Can I Kiss You?” show where so many students and teachers were talking afterwards. She even received a call from a parent saying, “Thank you for bringing Mike to speak.” That parent’s sons came home at night and initiated a conversation about respecting women!

Since Mike’s presentations were towards the end of the school year, we diligently worked with the schools’ staff to build on the momentum Mike’s appearance had created. At all three high schools, students created posters with messages (in English and Spanish) reinforcing the points from the “Can I Kiss You?” presentations. The posters, along with The Date Safe Project’s “Do You Ask?” posters, were put up in the schools – a great reminder for students as they start their summer vacations. In addition to making posters, the students signed their names on a large white sheet of paper that had The Date Safe Project’s Pledge for Action attached to it. The names on the list are adding up every day as the student bodies now have the opportunity to sign.

As a result of Mike’s presentations, one of the high school’s Student Council organized an Awareness Day. Hope House provided The Date Safe Project’s “Can I Kiss You?” tattoos for students to wear during the event. The students created a display of Mike’s books along with other school library books related to sexual and dating violence. Hope House gave out helpline cards and brochures. Plus, teal and purple ribbons to raise awareness about sexual assault and domestic violence were distributed.

With the “Can I Kiss You?” presentations being the catalyst, Hope House is continuing to meet with school staff and students to create additional activities over the summer and for next year, such as putting their posters up in popular summer hang-out spots, working with students during a summer leadership program, publishing an article for parents in the schools’ fall newsletter, and creating social norms posters from the results of student assembly pre-show and post-show surveys. All of these opportunities and exciting momentum would not have happened without Mike’s programs.






