

## Author Michael Domitrz to present book 'May I Kiss You?'

Local author Michael Domitrz, will speak on his book "May I Kiss You?" tonight at 7 p.m.

The University of Wisconsin-Whitewater's SEAL and Sexual Assault Prevention Advisory committee will be sponsoring the event that will take place in the Commons (UC 111) of the University Center.

Domitrz has been traveling the country for over a decade speaking to students, teachers, and parents on safe and respectful ways of dating.

In his book "May I Kiss You?" he tackles the questions of dating, communication, respect, as well as the crime of sexual assault.

Domitrz had been doing his presentation on high school and college campuses across the country for years when people started to approach him with the idea of writing a book about his experiences, thoughts,

and ideas.

It was then that he realized he had stumbled upon a great idea and resource.

“I really wanted to write this book to help open minds to a more respectful way of dating for today’s youth.” Domitrz said.

His drive to speak on this subject roots back to his own college days at UW-Whitewater.

In 1989, he received a phone call from his mother saying that his sister had been raped.

His sister’s experience drove Domitrz to become educated enough to speak to youth and make sure that this crime didn’t happen to someone else.

Through years of study, he created an interactive program to educate the public on sexual assault awareness.

Domitrz’s program had been so well received that in 1992, he was recognized as “One of the Top 10 Collegiate Entrepreneurs” in America.

Also, in 1996, he was awarded the honor of being “One of the Outstanding Young Men in America.”

“May I Kiss You?” covers almost every aspect of dating.

Who pays? Will there be a ‘good-night’ kiss? What should the conversation be? Where should the date

take place? What time of day? How can you get to know your date?

These are just a few examples of the topics Domitrz will touch base on. Also, the book is a candid look at dating.

“I want this presentation to inspire healthier and safer views on dating, but also to remind people that dating is fun.” explained Domitrz.
